Nod Cronfa Gymunedol Uchel Siryfion Gwent yw darparu ansawdd bywyd diogelach a gwell i bobl Gwent drwy gefnogi mentrau a phrosiectau a leolir yn y gymuned sy'n gostwng troseddau ac sy'n gwella diogelwch cymunedol.

Dyfernir grantiau yn y digwyddiad gwneud cyfranogiad blynyddol ar **Ddydd Sadwrn 23 o Fawrth 2019**

Beth yw Gwneud Grantiau Cyfranogol?

Mae gwneud grantiau cyfranogol yn golygu datganoli penderfyniadau ynglŷn â gwneud grantiau i'r gymuned leol. Mae'n galluogi pobl leol i benderfynu sut orau i fynd i'r afael â materion lleol drwy gefnogi mentrau sy'n dangos orau ddatrysiadau effeithiol i'r problemau y mae cymunedau yng Ngwent yn eu hwynebu.

Cynhelir y digwyddiad mewn partneriaeth â Swyddfa Comisiynydd Heddlu a Throseddau Gwent. Gwahoddir ymgeiswyr sydd ar y rhestr fer i fynychu'n digwyddiad blynyddol ynghylch gwneud grantiau ar y **23 o Fawrth, 2019**. Cynhelir digwyddiad eleni yn Nhrefynwy.

Pwy a all ymgeisio?

Grwpiau cymunedol, mudiadau gwirfoddol ac elusennau lleol yng Ngwent, hynny yw, ardaloedd awdurdodau lleol Casnewydd, Blaenau Gwent, Torfaen, Sir Fynwy a Chaerffili.

Nodwch, os gwelwch yn dda: Rhoddir blaenoriaeth i grwpiau cymunedol lleol ac elusennau bychain. Os ydych yn elusen o fwy o faint ac yn dymuno ymgeisio, cysylltwch, os gwelwch yn dda, â'r Sefydliad i drafod eich cynigiad yn gyntaf.

The Gwent High Sheriffs' Community Fund

Background

The Gwent High Sheriffs' Community Fund aims to provide a safer and better quality of life for the people of Gwent by supporting community-based initiatives and projects that reduce crime and improve community safety.

There is a strong emphasis on projects which aim to mentor and support young people across Gwent, however, the Fund will also consider initiatives which address broader community safety issues.

Grants will be awarded at the annual participatory grant-making event on **Saturday 23rd March 2018**.

What is Participatory Grant-Making?

Participatory grant-making is about devolving grant making decisions to the local community. It enables local people to decide how best to address local issues by choosing to support initiatives that best demonstrate effective solutions to the problems facing communities in Gwent.

The event is run in partnership with the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Gwent. Shortlisted applicants will be invited to attend our annual grant making event on the **23rd March 2018**. This year's event will be held in Monmouth.

Who can apply?

Community groups, voluntary organisations and local charities in Gwent i.e. the local authority areas of Newport, Blaenau Gwent, Torfaen, Monmouthshire and Caerphilly.

Please note: There is a preference for grassroots organisations where volunteers play a key role in project delivery. If you are a larger charity/not-for-profit organisation and wish to apply please contact the Foundation to discuss your proposal first.

Mae'n rhaid i bob ymgeisydd:

- Fod yn gallu dangos sut mae'u gweithgareddau'n cyfrannu at ostwng troseddau, creu gwell cyfleoedd i blant a phobl ifanc a gwella diogelwch i breswylwyr;
- Meddu ar gyfrif banc grŵp/sefydliad, gan na ellir gwneud dyfardaliadau i unigolion nac i gyfrifon banc personol;
- Bod â chyfansoddiad priodol (er nad o angenrheidrwydd yn elusen gofrestredig);
- Bod yn gallu cyflenwi'u cyfrifon blyneddol archwiliedig diweddaraf, neu, o leiaf dystiolaeth o incwm a gwariant diweddar.

Grantiau sydd ar gael

Gwahoddir grwpiau i ymgeisio am grantiau o hyd at **£5,000** i gynnal ystod o gostau a allai gynnwys:

- Treialu prosiect newydd;
- Costau cynnal ar gyfer rhaglen weithgareddau;
- Prynu cyfarpar a deunyddiau.

Wrth ysgrifennu eich cais, gwnewch yn siŵr bod eich prosiect wedi'i gostio'n llawn gydag achos cryf am gefnogaeth i'r gwariant rydych yn ei gynnwys.

Grant aml-flynedd

Rydym yn cydnabod pa mor bwysig yw hi i grwpiau allu cynllunio ar gyfer y dyfodol ac pa mor ddefnyddiol yw hi i gael sicrwydd o arian i allu ddatblygu'ch prosiectau am y tymor hir.

Rydym yn bwriadu dyfarnu o leiaf un grants i ymgeisydd llwyddiannus gyda'g grant hyd at £5,000 y flwyddyn am dair blynedd eleni.

Rydych angen cwblhau cwestiwn ychwanegol ar y ffurflen gais os hoffech gael eich ystyried am y grant tair blynedd. Fydd angen i chi nodi sut rydych chi'n bwriadu datblygu eich prosiect dros y cyfnod hwn.

Sut i ymgeisio

I ymgeisio, mae'n rhaid i ymgeiswyr gwblhau ffurflen gais i'w chyflwyno i'r Sefydliad Cymunedol yng Nghymru erbyn yr **31^{ain} o Ionawr, 2019**. Mae'r ffurflen gais ar-lein ar gael ar wefan y Sefydliad Cymunedol yng Nghymru (www.cfiw.org.uk).

All applicants must:

- Be able to demonstrate how their activities contribute to reducing crime, creating better opportunities for children and young people and increasing safety for residents
- Have a group/organisation bank account, as awards cannot be made to individuals or personal bank accounts
- Be properly constituted (although not necessarily a registered charity)
- Be able to supply their latest audited annual accounts, or, at the very least, evidence of recent income and expenditure

Grants available

Groups are invited to apply for grants of up to **£5,000** to support a range of costs which could include:

- Piloting a new project
- Running costs for a programme of activities
- Purchasing equipment and materials

When writing submitting your application please ensure that your project is fully costed with a strong case for support for the planned expenditure.

Multi-year funding

We recognise how important it is for groups to be able to plan for the future and that having secure funding can give you the confidence and reassurance to develop your projects over the long-term.

This year will be looking to award at least one successful applicant up to £5,000 a year for three years.

In order to be considered for this three-year grant please complete the additional section of the application form indicating how you plan to develop your project over this period.

How to apply

To apply applicants must complete an application form to be submitted to the Community Foundation in Wales by the **31st January 2019**. The online application form is available on the Community Foundation in Wales (www.cfiw.org.uk) website.
